## PHONICS/READING

In phonics we are working on -er, -le, and contractions. We will work on these sounds in our phonics readers, "Lost and Found" and "What Will Lester Be?".

The story in our anthology is "Jalapeno Bagels". We are working on the strategy of questions, following directions, and parts of a book. High frequency words are early, hair, and instead. Vocabulary words are -
bakery, a place where bread and other baked goods are made and sold
culture, a group of people who share traditions and customs
customers, people who buy things at a store
dough, a soft, thick mixture that is shaped and baked
ingredients, parts of a mixture recipe, a set of directions for cooking

Please have your child read at least 75 minutes a week. Children are to return their reading logs and folders for checking the first day of each week.

Please continue to work on the Dolch words. The Dolch words are high frequency words that children need to learn to help them read fluently.

MATH
In math this week we will review measuring with inches, feet, centimeters, and decimeters; investigate the idea of accuracy by exploring $1 / 8$ inch, $1 / 16$ inch, and $1 / 2$ centimeter on a ruler, and measuring to the nearest half-inch and half-centimeter; find perimeters by measuring to the nearest centimeter or inch; and identify the mile and kilometer as standard units for longer distances and solving problems about road-map distances.

We will have a money test on Monday, a renaming test in addition and a timed addition/subtraction facts test on Tuesday, a clock test on Wednesday, a renaming test in subtraction and a timed addition/subtraction facts test on Thursday, and a math concepts quiz on Friday. The children will have math homework every day except Friday.
PRINTING/ENGLISH
In printing we are working on proper formation, spacing, and neatness. It is very important that the children print neatly on all of their work. In English we are working on dictionary skills, present tense verbs, and sticking to the point in an essay. Children are required to use proper punctuation in all of their work.

## SOCIAL STUDIES/SCIENCE

In social studies we are discussing working together to solve problems in our homes, groups, and communities. We are also working on self-control and following procedures.

In science we are discussing simple machines. We will be comparing how surfaces can change the force on an object, understanding friction, and recognizing how a force and the direction of a force can change, Vocabulary words are force, gravity, friction, simple machines, lever, fulcrum, and ramp
