## PHONICS/READING

In phonics we are working on un-, -le, and $-y$. We will work on these sounds in our phonics readers, "Aunt Lizzy Finds Her Cake" and "My Brother". The story in our anthology is "Carousel". We are working on the strategy of predict/infer, making judgments, and reference materials. High frequency words are aunt, million, and pair. Vocabulary words for this week are angry: to feel upset about something fussed: talked in an unhappy way; complained
groaned: made a deep moaning sound grumbled: talked in an angry way about something that's not pleasing grumpily: in a grouchy way promised: said he or she would do something

We will also finish our DECCA testing this week in reading and math. Please encourage your child to do their best on these assessments.

Please have your child read at least 15 minutes every day or a total of 75 minutes a week. Children are to return their reading logs and folders for checking the first day of each week.

Please continue to work on the Dolch words. The Dolch words are high frequency words that children need to learn to help them read fluently.

## MATH

In math we will identify the mile and kilometer as standard units for longer distances and solve problems about roadmap distances; explore the capacities of cylinders and find the areas of shapes by using inch and centimeter grids; explore measuring tools and units of measure and provide experiences with the concept of area. We will have a money test on Monday, a renaming test in addition and a timed addition/subtraction facts test on Tuesday, a clock test on Wednesday, a timed addition/subtraction facts test and a renaming test in subtraction on Thursday, and a concepts quiz on Friday. The children will have math homework every day except Friday.
PRINTING/ENGLISH
In printing we are working on proper formation, spacing, and neatness. In English we are working on sticking to the point in an essay, using past tense verbs, combining sentences, and writing informative paragraphs. Children are required to use proper punctuation in all of their work. SOCIAL STUDIES/SCIENCE

In science we are discussing simple machines. We will be comparing how surfaces can change the force on an object, understanding friction, and recognizing how a force and the direction of a force can change, Vocabulary words are force, gravity,
friction, simple machines, lever, fulcrum, and ramp
