PHONICS/READING

In phonics we are working on vowel sounds. We will be reading and discussing fables and a play. We are also working on a reading/writing workshop on the friendly letter. We will also write friendly letters.

Please have your child read at least 75 minutes a week. Children are to return their reading logs and folders for checking the first day of each week.

Please continue to work on the Dolch words. The Dolch words are high frequency words that children need to learn to help them read fluently.

<u>MATH</u>

In math we will measure lengths and distances to the nearest inch and centimeter, adding 2- and 3-digit numbers, using estimation to check If answers are reasonable, sharing solution strategies for finding the sum of 2-digit numbers mentally, using base-10 blocks to add two 2-digit numbers, practicing addition fact extensions, estimating sums by changing the addends to "close but easier" numbers, and completing an unit test. We will have a money test on Monday, an addition/subtraction facts test on Tuesday and Thursday, a clock test on Wednesday, and a math concepts quiz on Thursday.

PRINTING/ENGLISH

In printing we are working on proper formation, spacing, and neatness. In English we are working on alphabetical order, exact nouns, dictionary skills, special nouns, web notes, and note taking. Children are required to use proper punctuation in all of their work.

SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES

In science we are discussing how the Sun shines on the Earth, that the Sun is a star that gives Earth heat and light, and how the Earth rotates on its axis and how this rotation causes day and night. Science vocabulary for this unit is: rotate, axis, Sun, orbit, and equator.

In social studies we are discussing Thanksgiving.

CLASSROOM PROJECTS

The children have earned \$10.02 toward the purchase of an Operation USO Care Package. These packages are created and delivered to members of the U.S. Armed Forces deployed around the world to show them they have not been forgotten and to provide a 'touch of home'.
