PHONICS/READING

In phonics we will continue to work on contractions. This week we will be reading fables and Thanksgiving books.

Please have your child read at least 75 minutes a week. Children are to return their reading logs and folders for checking the first day of each week.

Please continue to work on the Dolch words. The Dolch words are high frequency words that children need to learn to help them read fluently.

<u>SPELLING</u>

Due to the short week, we will not have a new spelling list this week. We will note how many words we can create using the letters in Thanksgiving. We will also work on alphabetical order and spelling patterns. <u>MATH</u>

In math we are working on our Unit 4 assessment and the attributes of shapes.

We will have a money quiz on Monday, an addition facts test and a subtraction facts test and a renaming test in addition on Tuesday, and a clocks Wednesday. Please practice these skills.

PRINTING/ENGLISH

In printing we are working on proper formation, spacing, and neatness. In English we are working on nouns, adjectives, exact nouns, and alphabetical order. We will continue to review sentences and punctuation. Children are required to use proper punctuation in all of their work.

SOCIAL STUDIES/SCIENCE

In social studies we are discussing Thanksgiving.

In science we are discussing how the Sun shines on the Earth, that the Sun is a star that gives Earth heat and light, and how the Earth rotates on its axis and how this rotation causes day and night. Science vocabulary for this unit is: rotate, axis, Sun, orbit, and equator.

CLASSROOM PROJECTS

We have earned \$15.38 from "star" and "A" papers toward the purchase of an Operation USO Package. We will continue to work on this project. These packages are created and delivered to members of the U.S. Armed Forces deployed around the world to show them they have not been forgotten and to provide a 'touch of home'. These USO Care Packages at minimum, include requested items such as prepaid worldwide phone cards, sunscreen, travel size toiletries, disposable camera and a message from the donor thanking them for their service and sacrifice. The children are earning a penny for every "star" paper or "A" paper. The children may also bring in donations for this project.

We have begun working on a holiday card project in which we exchange holiday cards with 35 other classrooms in the United States plus send cards to a local fire or police department. The theme this year is *snow*. Our cards will be sent out the first week of December. We are also doing a gingerbread card exchange in December with 25 classrooms in the United States.
